We know for example that children from the poorest backgrounds can be over a year behind in their vocabulary when they start formal education – a gap, which often widens as they move through school.

The **Course Aims** to enable participants better support and improve children's outcomes by developing knowledge and practical skills to effectively impact on the teaching of vocabulary in the classroom.

After attending participants will be able to:

- Understand the importance of vocabulary for learning and literacy.
- Identify which words to teach.
- Teach new words so that children can more easily retain them.
- Use strategies for putting words to work in the classroom.
- Take a whole school approach to word learning.
